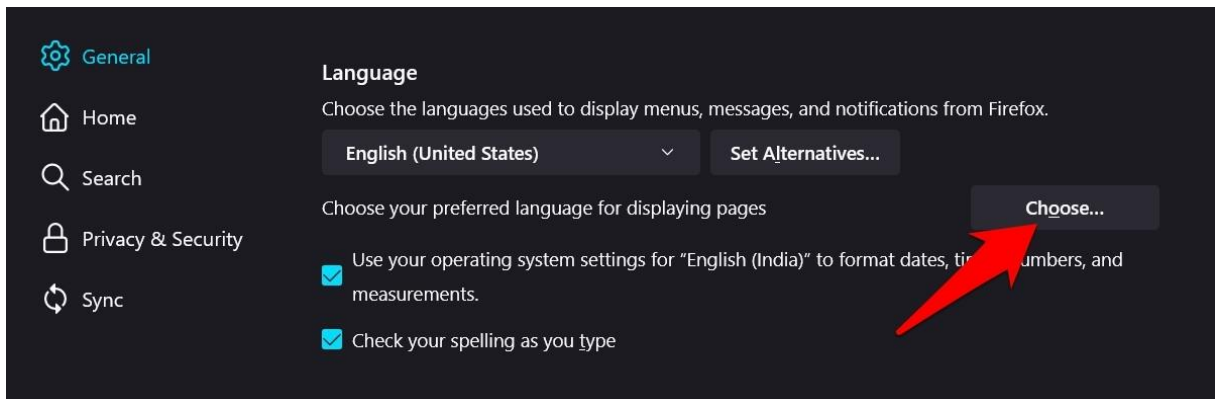


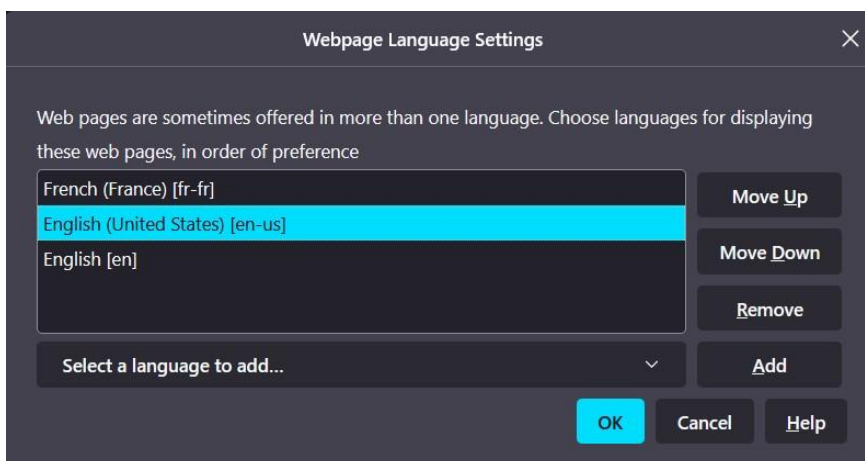
How to change your language settings in your Browser:

Firefox (for translation via Add-on go to the next page)

1. Ensure that the correct language pack is installed. Do the language preference changes before logging in to Security Identity Manager.
2. Launch the Mozilla Firefox Browser.
3. Copy-paste the below text in the address bar to open General Preferences.
about:preferences#general
4. Scroll down to the Language section.
5. Click on the choose button next, to Choose your preferred language for displaying pages.



6. Click on Select a language to add and add all your preferred languages from the list.
7. Change the order of preferences using the Move Up or Move down.

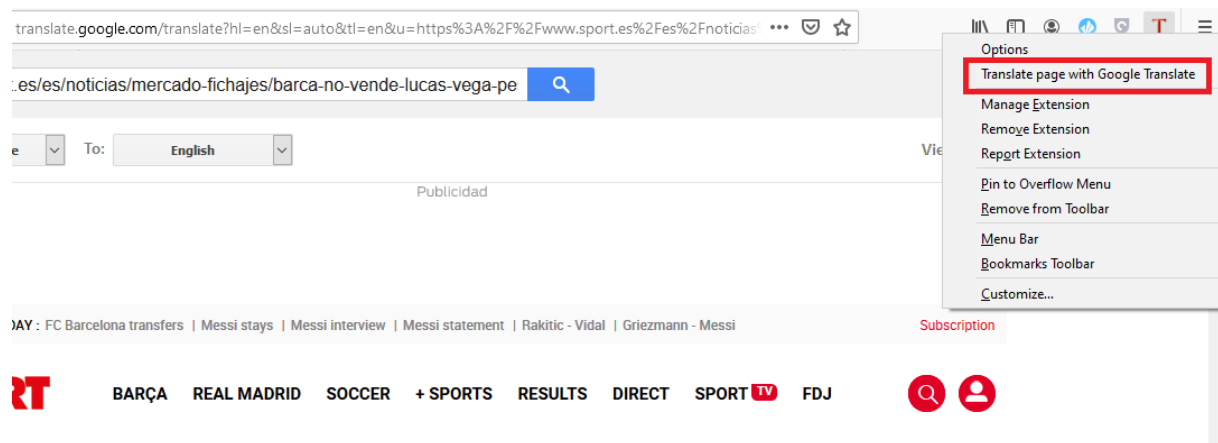


8. Hit OK to save the changes.

Translate in Firefox using Add-on:

In this example, we shall use the Google Translate Add-on because it is simple and straight to the point.

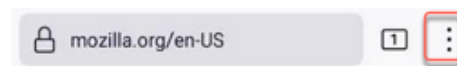
1. Launch the Mozilla Firefox browser on your computer.
2. Visit the **Firefox add-ons page** and search for **Google Translate**.
3. Click on **Install** and follow the steps to install the add-on to your browser.
4. On the address bar, enter the link to the **webpage** you would like to translate.
5. Go to the **Translate icon**. At the top right-hand corner shown by the letter **T** and right-click on it.




6. Select the option of a **Translate page with Google translate**.
7. This will open another tab with a translation for that webpage.

Firefox on mobile devices:

1. Tap the menu button.
2. Choose **Settings**.
3. Tap **Language**.
4. Tap a language from the list to choose it. Choose **Follow device language** to match your device's language instead.



Chrome:

1. Open the Chrome browser on your computer.
2. Go to a foreign language website.
3. Click "Translate" to the right of the address bar  .
4. Your website will be translated on your Chrometab.

Doesn't work? Try updating the website. If this does not work and the page is still not translated, right-click anywhere on the page. Then select Translate to [your preferred Language].

Chrome on mobile devices:


Select the target language below.

1. If you want to change the default language, tap the three-dot menu 

› More languages


2. select the desired language.

The website is translated once in the Chrometab.

If you always want to translate pages in this language, tap the three-dot menu 
› Always translate [language].

Doesn't work? Try updating the website. If you still can't tap the Translate option, there may be no translation available for this language.


If you cannot find the Translate option at the bottom of a page, you can manually select automatic translation.


On an Android smartphone or tablet, open the Chrome app  .

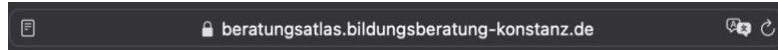
Tap the three-dot menu to the right of the address bar  › Translate...

Tip: If you want to translate a language from your list, tap the language and select Offer translation.

Safari:

1. In the Safari app  on your Mac, go to the web page you want to translate.

If the web page can be translated, the address field displays the Translate button .



2. Click the Translate button , then choose a language.

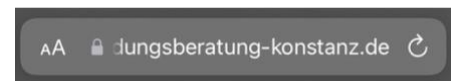
If a language isn't available

You may be able to make more languages available in the Translate menu by adding the languages in Language & Region preferences. Once you add a language to your list of preferred languages, if a translation is available to that language, it will appear in the Translate menu in Safari.

Translate a webpage in Safari on iOS 14.

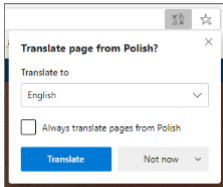
This function is only available on iOS 14.

1. Open Safari.
2. Go to the website you'd like to translate.
3. Tap the AA button in the address bar.
4. Select the language you would like to translate to.
5. Tap Enable Translation.



Microsoft Edge:

1. Open a webpage in Microsoft Edge. The browser will detect the language of the page and a menu will appear asking you to confirm that you want to translate the page.

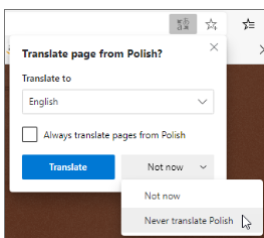


2. In the Translate to dropdown, choose the language you want the page translated into. The default is the language you've set for Microsoft Edge.

To translate the page, click Translate.

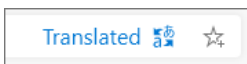
To always translate from the source language automatically, select the Always translate from [Language] check box.


To skip translation, in the list on the lower right, select Not now to skip translation or Never translate [Language] to never have the panel appear when you go to a page using that language.

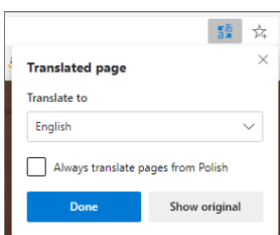


Note: You can manually return to this panel later, even if you select the option to Never translate.

Inside the address bar, you'll briefly see the status showing that the page has been translated.



If you select the translate icon  in the address bar, the menu that appears also shows the status.



Edge on mobile devices:

1. Go to **Settings and more > Settings** .
2. Select **Languages** from the Settings list.
3. To add a language to the list of **Preferred languages**, select **Add languages**.
4. Once the language is added, select next to the language, and then choose **Display Microsoft Edge in this language**.
